




The Skull in the Rock: How a Scientist, a Boy, and Google Earth Opened a New Window on Human Origins (Hardback)

From the fossil hunter who discovered the Homo naledi fossils in September 2015, this book is an amazing account of Lee Berger s 2008 hunt -- with the help of his curious 9-year-old son -- for a previously unknown species of ape-like creatures that may have been direct ancestors of modern humans. The discovery of two remarkably well preserved, twomillion-year-old fossils of an adult female and young male, known as Australopiitecus sediba, has beenhailed as one of the most important archaeological discoveries in history. The fossils reveal what may be one of humankind s oldest ancestors. Berger believes the skeletons they found on the Malapa site in South Africa could be the Rosetta stone that unlocks our understanding of the genus Homo and may just redesign the human family tree. Berger, an Eagle Scout and National Geographic Grantee, is the Reader in Human Evolution and the Public Understanding of Science in the Institute for Human Evolution at the University of Witwatersrand, Johannesburg, South Africa.
