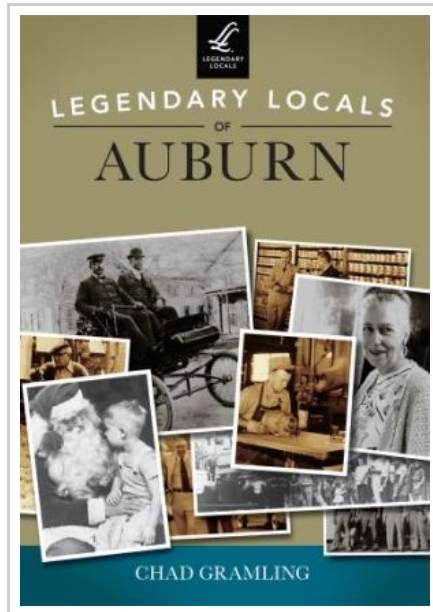




Legendary Locals of Auburn, Indiana
