




Memorial of Oscar Lovell Shafter: Being Words Spoken at His Burial by REV. Dr. Stebbins (Classic Reprint)

Dr. Stebbins Late Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of California, died in Florence, Italy, January 23d, 1873. The funeral took place at the First Congregational Church, Oakland, Cal., Sunday afternoon, March 24th, 1873. The rear dais and the organ loft were beautifully decked with wreaths and festoons of green leaves, immortelles, camelias and white roses. Wreaths were laid on the cover of the casket, and at the head was a large cross, composed of camelias and evergreens. The pall-bearers were S. W. Sanderson, John Cur-rey, A. L. Rhodes, Samuel Merritt, John W. Dwindle, William T. Wallace, Joseph P. Hoge, J. D. Thornton, Edmond L. Goold, J. B. Crockett and Henry Durant. The services were conducted by Rev. L. Hamilton, of the Independent Presbyterian Church; Rev. H. J. McLean, of the First Congregational, assisting. The following remarks were made by the Rev.
